## What's New

## New Requirement for Registering a Contract with the Vendor Support Center

As part of GSA's ongoing commitment to your privacy and security, there is a new requirement for registering a contract with the Vendor Support Center (VSC). Previously, all that was needed to register was a Contract Number and Unique Entity Identifier (UEI). As of February 16, 2023, you must also be an Authorized Negotiator to register a contract. Note: This requirement does not apply to VA contracts.

If you need to add personnel to your contract as an Authorized Negotiator or Authorized Negotiator to Sign, you must submit an administrative modification to update the contract. ## **Entity Validations in SAM.gov**

We recognize that many contractors are still experiencing delays in getting their entity registrations updated in SAM.gov. Extremely high demand by entities needing to update their entity registration at SAM.gov has created processing delays. While SAM.gov is working to address demand and improve response times, should you need help with the SAM.gov entity registration process, please contact the supporting Federal Service Desk (FSD). FSD hosts a wealth of information in a searchable knowledge base, can assist with most issues, and should be the first resource in almost all cases.

## GSA Advantage Order Status - Tracking Cancellation and On-time Scores!

Attention Advantage contractors!

Thanks to your efforts, the percentage of orders with delivery/shipped status has increased tremendously! If your contract is eligible to receive orders via GSA Advantage, then this applies to you.

Beginning with scores sent out on February 15, 2023, we will begin enforcing minimum on-time and cancellation scores to further assist our customers. To read more about this new policy visit the Interact post about Tracking Cancellation and On-time Scores.

## **Updated Model Subcontracting Plans**

The GSA Multiple Award Schedule (MAS) Program is implementing new subcontracting plan templates. Effective January 25, 2023, we updated Commercial and Individual Subcontracting Plans. Model Subcontracting Plans are often used as a tool by "other than small businesses (OTSB)" to complete their small business subcontracting plans when the total value of the acquisition exceeds \$750,000. Contracting officers also use Model Subcontracting Plans to understand the statutory requirements

The updated plans affect new offers and new subcontracting plans as of January 25, 2023.

## Reminder! No Action Needed for Erroneous Change of Name, Address, or Novation Email

In July, we shared this <u>Interact post related to the entity validation process and certain minor punctuation</u> (periods, commas, etc.) and abbreviations in a company name; or the address may have changed. This is resulting in a mismatch between an entity's name in SAM.gov and our MAS systems. This mismatch triggers a Name Change, Address Change, or Novation modification notification.

We are working with various FAS offices and GSA Office of General Counsel to develop a solution to solve this problem. In the meantime, please continue to ignore emails you may have received with the subject line: "Reminder to create a change of name, or novation modification" emails unless in fact you do require a Name Change, Address Change, or Novation modification.

We highly recommend you follow the <u>IAE Industry Community</u> on Interact for important IAE systems updates and stay up to date on topics related to SAM.gov and other IAE applications.

## New "Interested" Feature in eBuy Brings Benefits to Both Buyers and Sellers

We have added a brand new feature to eBuy! As of December 29, 2022, contractors may notify a customer that they are interested in a Request for Information (RFI) or Request for Quote (RFQ). ## Multiple Award Schedule Program Working to Address Inflationary Impacts

GSA remains committed to identifying opportunities to reduce the impact of inflation on our industry partners. GSA issued <u>Supplement 1 to GSA Acquisition Letter MV-22-02</u>, which extended a temporary moratorium on the enforcement of certain limitations contained in GSA Economic Price Adjustment (EPA) contract clauses from September 30, 2022 to March 31, 2023. The supplement also streamlines and enhances the ability for FAS contracting officers to respond to and process EPA requests. #### GSA OGP and FAS OPC recently extended the AL in Supplement 2 to September 30, 2023.

## **Robomod Updates and Contract Compliance**

Compliance with the terms and conditions of your Multiple Award Schedule is critical to the success of the MAS program! This December, FAS continued taking action to remove non-compliant products from MAS contracts and GSA Advantage. FAS is removing products that are:

- Not compliant with <u>FAR clause 52.204-23</u>, Prohibition on Contracting for Hardware, Software, and Services Developed or Provided by Kaspersky Lab and Other Covered Entities.
- Not compliant with <u>FAR clause 52.204-25</u>, Prohibition on Contracting for Certain Telecommunications and Video Surveillance Services or Equipment.
- Not compliant with <u>FAR clause 52.225-5</u>, *Trade Agreements*. FAS is using high confidence Country of Origin data from the <u>Verified Products Portal (VPP)</u> to identify non-compliant products.

Please take steps to ensure non-compliant products are not offered on your MAS contract! In accordance with <u>I-FSS-600</u> *Contract Price Lists*, contractors are responsible for ensuring that items removed from contract through the Robomod process are not listed on GSA Advantage and that the items are not added again through future catalog submissions via SIP or EDI.

FAS Contracting Officers may take corrective action if contractors repeatedly offer non-compliant products. For more information about FAS initiatives to remove non-compliant products, visit the <u>Vendor Support Center</u>, Supply Chain Risk Management section.

## **Updates to Current MAS Programs**

## Keep Your GSA Advantage Catalog Up to Date

Did you know you are required to update your Contract Price List every two years? That's right, electronic catalogs/price lists previously submitted to GSA, in accordance with Schedule contract clause I-FSS-600(a) Contract Price List, must be updated every two years.

Why is this so important? Old catalogs/price lists may contain discontinued items and out-dated pricing, which when ordered online, cause problems for agency customers and you, the contractor. Your contract requires that you honor pricing contained in your published catalog, whether printed or electronic.

To stay in compliance with your contract, please be sure to update your catalog/price list regularly.

## MAS Consolidation Phase 3

Have more than one MAS contract under the same Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)? Your company may need to take action during Phase 3 of MAS Consolidation to move all your offerings to one surviving MAS contract.

You should make all consolidation actions in coordination with your GSA Contracting Officer and in accordance with your agreed upon Phase 3 Consolidation Checklist and Plan.

These consolidation plans are the first step in determining your surviving contract and to start the process of getting to one contract. No Phase 3 modifications will be approved without an approved plan.

The MAS PMO has posted all Phase 3 supplier resources on the Vendor Support Center, including our MAS Consolidation Phase 3 Guide for Industry. This new resource takes you through all the critical consolidation steps.

  - One contract has a small business set-aside (SBSA) Special Item Number (SIN) or
  - One contract is a follow-on contract with the same SIN(s)
- Your company only has one MAS contract

## The FAS Catalog Platform (FCP) Pilot is Here

The new FAS Catalog Platform (FCP) pilot kicks off this month! The FCP, previously called the Common Catalog Platform (CCP), will replace the outdated Schedule Input Program (SIP) and introduce new features that make it easier to manage catalogs. Contractors can <u>watch a demo of the new platform</u> to learn more.

Following a successful pilot, GSA will begin transitioning all MAS contractors to this new platform. GSA anticipates beginning this process in October 2023.

### **Prepare for the FCP Transition**

Contractors can take the following steps now:

- 1 Contractors can fill out the <u>GSA FAS Catalog Platform User Transition form</u> to provide key details about their catalog that will help inform the contract transition sequence.
- 2 Contractors should ensure their Authorized Negotiators are up to date. FCP will require that users are assigned as Authorized Negotiators on their MAS contract, with or without signing authority.
- Contractors with product catalogs who have not submitted a full catalog replacement file since October 2022 are encouraged to submit one following their next contract modification. This will provide initial catalog data migration to prepare for FCP. To learn more, visit this <u>Interact post about MAS Contractors Encouraged to Submit Catalog Replacement File</u>.

#### **New Service File (Under Development!)**

GSA previously announced that the FCP will use the new Product File, a data template that combines, consolidates, and replaces the Products Price Proposal Template and the information required to sell on GSA Advantage.

GSA is now developing the Service File, a new template that contractors will use to submit service catalogs to the FCP. GSA is in the process of arranging contractor feedback sessions, which will be held in April, May, and June of this year.
