### Transition to Unique Entity ID (SAM)

On April 4, 2022, the government will stop using the Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) and will transition to using the new Unique Entity ID (SAM). Our MAS acquisition systems are being updated to reflect this change.

There are also changes coming to our eTools (eLibrary, GSA Advantage, and eBuy). Please keep an eye on your email for more information about these upcoming important changes.

## GSA Piloting Manufacturer Stock Disruption Indicators on GSA Advantage!

GSA Advantage! will now display stock disruption information as manufacturers and wholesalers report issues in the Verified Products Portal (VPP).

Effective January 13, 2022, any product with a stock issue reported in VPP will have a banner displayed on GSA Advantage! advising customers of the disruption.

## New Pilot Removes Products Offered By Unauthorized Suppliers on GSA Advantage!

GSA is piloting a new Robomod process to ensure products awarded on Multiple Award Schedule (MAS) contracts and displayed on GSA Advantage! are only offered by authorized sellers. Per clause I-FSS-644, MAS contractors can only offer and sell products that have been authorized under the manufacturer's supplier authorization program.

Unauthorized MAS contractors are identified based on information from the Verified Products Portal (VPP). The VPP is GSA's official source for supplier authorization information and allows GSA to obtain supplier authorization data directly from participating manufacturers and their authorized partners.

## Important Update on FAS's Implementation of E.O.14026, Increasing the Minimum Wage for Federal Contractors

In April 2021, President Biden issued Executive Order (EO) 14026, Increasing the Minimum Wage for Federal Contractors. The order promotes economy and efficiency in Federal procurement by raising the hourly minimum wage paid by contractors to workers performing work on or in connection with covered Federal contracts to \$15.00 per hour, effective January 30, 2022. The EO also provides for annual wage increases set by the Department of Labor starting in January 2023.

DoD, GSA, and NASA recently issued an <u>interim rule</u> amending the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) to implement EO 14026 and a <u>final rule</u> issued by the Department of Labor.

### E.O. 14042: Ensuring Adequate COVID Safety Protocols for Federal Contractors

The United States District Court for the Southern District of Georgia issued a preliminary injunction on December 7, 2021, that halts enforcement of FAR clause 52.223-99 Ensuring Adequate COVID-19 Safety Protocols for Federal Contractors in GSA contracts and contract-like instruments implementing the Safer Federal Workforce Taskforce guidance for contractors and subcontractors nationwide.

Due to this injunction GSA and federal agencies using GSA contracts will take no action to enforce FAR Clause 52.223-99. The Safer Federal Workforce Taskforce is maintaining a website with current information related to this subject and federal contractors at:

#### **Retired! Vendor Education Center**

The Vendor Education Center (VEC) was successfully retired on December 17, 2021!

The Pathways to Success training and the Readiness Assessment are now available at gsa.gov MAS Roadmap. For prospective contractors, the requirement to upload the Pathway to Success training certificate and the completed Readiness Assessment with your offer no longer applies. You must now simply acknowledge that you have completed the self-paced training and Readiness Assessment when submitting your offer through GSA's eOffer system.

Phase 3 Recorded Training for Impacted Contractors - August 2020 Deadline for submitting your Phase 3 consolidation plan and checklist has been extended to April 30, 2022.

Have more than one MAS contract under the same DUNS number or Unique Entity ID (SAM)? Your company may need to take action during Phase 3 of MAS Consolidation to move all your offerings to one surviving MAS contract.

All consolidation actions should be made in coordination with your GSA Contracting Officer and in accordance with your agreed upon <u>Phase 3</u>. <u>Consolidation Checklist and Plan</u>.

These consolidation plans are the first step in determining your surviving contract and to start the process of getting to one contract per Unique Entity ID (SAM). **No Phase 3 modifications will be approved without a completed and approved plan.** 

The MAS PMO has posted all Phase 3 supplier resources on the <u>Vendor Support Center</u>, including our <u>MAS Consolidation Phase 3 Guide for Industry</u>. This new resource takes you through all the critical consolidation steps.

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Note: Phase 3 DOES NOT apply to you if:

- Your company manages two contracts and:
  - One contract has a small business set-aside (SBSA) Special Item Number (SIN) or
  - One contract is a follow-on contract with the same SIN(s)
- Your company only has one MAS contract

Please submit your Phase 3 Consolidation Checklist and Plan to your Contracting Officer(s), and copy maspmo@gsa.gov as soon as possible to get the process started.

#### **Catalog Management Updates**

#### GSA Begins Development of Common Catalog Platform (CCP)

Since our last update, GSA began development on the new Common Catalog Platform (CCP). The CCP will modernize catalog management for Multiple Award Schedule (MAS) contractors and the GSA workforce. The platform will introduce new functionality to simplify catalog creation for contractors and streamline the approval process for workforce members. The new CCP functionality will include, but is not limited to:

- CCP replacing the Schedule Input Program (SIP) with a web-based application that interacts with contracting systems to improve the current disjointed user experience.
- CCP introducing a new custom Product File to consolidate and replace the current SIP and Price Proposal Templates.
- CCP providing access to market research for contractors to address catalog deficiencies prior to submitting for government review.

The CMO team is leveraging Human Centered Design (HCD) principles to involve contractors, the Acquisition Workforce, and the Vendor Support Center during the design process and ensure CCP best meets users' needs. These engagements were kicked off in mid-February, and will continue through the end of the fiscal year. The team plans to pilot the CCP with a limited group of contractors in the beginning of FY23. More information on user transition will be shared in future newsletters.
